Yorkshire Practices Shine Through in White Rose Shortlist

Out of the 15 projects shortlisted for the 2008 RIBA Yorkshire White Rose Awards, only two practices are from outside the region. The region works hard to champion local firms and it's satisfying to see such high quality projects on this year's shortlist.

Projects shortlisted emphasise the growing focus on sustainability and conservation, as well as the indication that people are deciding to add to their homes rather than move. Investment in South Yorkshire is evident from the number of projects entered for the awards, with six architecture practices on the shortlist from the South Yorkshire sub region. We're delighted to have two strong contenders for the new Landscape Award presented in partnership with the Landscape Institute for excellence in public realm and communal space design.

Winners will be presented with certificates at the RIBA Yorkshire Awards Dinner on Friday 24 October at Leeds Town Hall. Guest host is the ever entertaining Barnsley based poet and broadcaster lan McMillan. Book your tickets now with <u>rachel.hughes@instriba.org</u>.

RIBA Teaching Practices

Many Schools have longstanding relationships with practitioners acting as consultants, part time teachers, and graduate employers. The concept of the Teaching Practice consolidates these links to offer practices a further stake in education, and more academic flexibility for the universities and their students.

York Minster Conservation CPD

RIBA Yorkshire has teamed up with The University of York, Centre for Conservation in a new partnership to deliver an afternoon of high quality CPD on 12 August. This 5 hour event will include a presentation by Dr Richard Shephard, Director of Development, at York Minster, on the York Minster East Front Project followed by a visit to the Minster for an in depth look at the masonry deterioration from the scaffold. A visit to the York Minster Stoneyard and the chance to see the working studios of The York Glaziers' Trust will round off the day.

New Design Awards Launched for Sheffield

For the first time, architects, community groups and members of the public are being given the opportunity to cast their votes for Sheffield's best building, in a competition being run in partnership by Sheffield Civic Trust and RIBA Yorkshire. The project is being supported by Creative Sheffield, Bond Bryan Architects, Arup Sheffield and Ibstock Brick.

The awards are open to any project within the city's boundary and consist of three categories. Architectural practices and industry professionals are being asked to put forward their nominations for The Best Building Award and The Neighbourhood & Community Design Award.

Nominations for the third category, The Citizen's Award, are supported by Sheffield Hallam University. This award is open to anyone who lives and works in Sheffield and the result will be decided by a public vote. Nominations are encouraged for buildings that people use and enjoy and that they feel are worthy of a city wide celebration.

The winners will be announced at a ceremony in February 2009 at The Circle, Sheffield with Ken Shuttleworth as guest host.
